the goal of teaching writing is to create independent and self motivated writers when students write more often they become better at writing they acquire habits skills and strategies that enable them to learn more about the craft of writing yet they require the guidance and support of a more knowledgeable person who understands the writing process the changes over time in writing development and specific techniques and procedures for teaching writing in scaffolding young writers a writers workshop approach linda j dorn and carla soffos present a clear road map for implementing writers workshop in the primary grades adopting an apprenticeship approach the authors show how explicit teaching good models clear demonstrations established routines assisted teaching followed by independent practice and self regulated learning are all fundamental in establishing a successful writers workshop there is a detailed chapter on organizing for writers workshop including materials components routines and procedures other chapters provide explicit guidelines for designing productive mini lessons and student conferences scaffolding young writers also features an overview of how children become writers analyses of students samples according to informal and formal writing assessments writing checklists benchmark behaviors and rubrics based on national standards examples of teaching interactions during mini lessons and writing conferences illustrations of completed forms and checklists with detailed descriptions and blank reproducible forms in the appendix for classroom use instruction is linked with assessment throughout the book so that all teaching interactions are grounded in what children already know and what they need to know as they develop into independent writers

effective narration the telling of stories or recounting of personal experiences is an art requiring skills that appear crucial for children s language development and literacy acquisition this volume serves an important purpose because it pulls together the widely scattered literature in the field exploring the ways in which oral narrative structure develops in children and how it may be facilitated it presents new empirical studies on genres of narrative the role narrative structure plays in emergent literacy the relationship between narrative language and autobiographical memory and ways in which teachers and parents facilitate or hinder children s narrative development the empirical research presented here draws from diverse groups including hispanic african american and anglo american children from rural and urban america and canada

this unique book presents a four year longitudinal study of the literacy development of children attending an austin texas area elementary school the

reading and writing development of this microcosm of at risk children was followed as they progressed from first through fourth grade the author poses the question what skills and abilities of the child and what classroom factors appear to foster literacy development included here are the author s models of reading and writing acquisition and application of these models to six children three with literacy problems and three with successful literacy development interviews with the children are presented along with measures of their cognitive development and skills samples of their reading and writing from and throughout the four year study and an examination of their successes and failures in relations to the models presented in earlier chapters additionally one chapter examines school related factors that may play a role in the children s reading development the book is intended for graduate students at all levels and literacy researchers who are interested in the process of literacy acquisition as it occurs in the school setting
